

ANIMAL CONTROL

In Summary

2017 has been a big year for Animal Control, with a lot of changes and improvements. It began with the hire of two new Animal Control Officers, Kari Sieniarecki and Lauren Richards. Both Officers went through various trainings including but not limited to: Euthanasia by Injection, Michigan Humane Society Animal Welfare Conference, and Michigan Humane Society's Animals in the Field course. After the training was completed, both Officers set out to make much needed changes within the shelter that would allow improved operation overall.

After working in the field during the summer of 2017, it was evident that there was an overpopulation of cats in Antrim County. At times there were large sums of cats and kittens brought in from various homes that exceeded the legal and appropriate limit of our facility. Unfortunately, some were too feral and too sick to rehome. It was at this time we decided to hold spay and neuter clinics to better assist the community with this growing problem. Clinics began in the late fall/early winter on Thursdays and the response was overwhelming. The clinics helped members of the community who were struggling to get their cats fixed which will help reduce the number of cats and kittens that come into the shelter over time.

We are excited to say that the clinics have helped and so far hundreds of cats have been fixed thus further assisting us with our need to control animal population.

Along with spay and neuter clinics comes the Trap and Release program which uses private funds to spay and neuter any feral cat that is living in the community. The newly spayed or neutered cat is then released back onto the property where it was captured.

In addition to the clinics and the Trap and Release program, social media tools, such as Facebook, have been an integral tool for our facility. Social media has been used to seek out and place feral cats that are commonly used as barn cats. Facebook has been our greatest aid in rehoming and reuniting animals this year not only in our community, but in other states as well.

It became a goal of ours to control animal population and increase vaccination. Animal Control has ensured that all animals adopted are either spayed or neutered prior to adoption, or that owners follow through and get animals fixed before they are six months of age. Private and local organizations have helped us by financially supporting all spay and neuters that occur prior to adoption; we have been very grateful for all of their medical contributions.

Through donations and assistance, we have been able to greatly increase the medical care of the animals that come through the shelter. Just about every animal has gone out with a rabies vaccine, deworming, first shot (FVRCP for cats and Distemper for dogs) and a flea treatment. In addition to all of the medical support we have received, a very kind gentleman donated all of the dog food we would need for 2018 (a total of approximately 500 pounds of dog food).

In summary, we have had an outstanding year and we cannot wait to see what 2018 brings as we move forward in the betterment of our facility and our goal of assisting our community members.







QUICK FACTS

The Zero Tolerance program had another successful and profitable year. The program ended 2017 with a profit of \$20,349.92. We are still seeing a fluctuation in our client testing numbers. In the start of 2017 our numbers were down significantly which in turn drives our revenue. Our client testing numbers throughout 2017 average 264 people per month for district, circuit, probate, DHS and other courts. Our MDOC client load averages 292 testing clients per month. These are figures for clients taking a urinalysis. Our PBT monthly average is 483 per month, totaling 5805 per year.






