Safety

We are proud of our safety record at Antrim County Airport. 2018 was another safe year for our pilots, passengers and staff.

Airport Operations

Our Aviation fuel sales for 2018 were once again strong and consistent with overall trends in aviation activity.

Airfield Improvements

Markings:

As the final piece to our runway surface

rehabilitation of 2017 we had the final control markings painted. Along with this we had new striping painted of the all the movement areas of the field.





Lighting: Thru the Michigan Block Grant Program, we received monies to upgrade our runway lighting system which included the complete removal of our old light assemblies and the installation of new, energy efficient LED light systems. This upgrade will provide us with a 35% cost savings over the previous system.

2018 Capital Outlay Program

Fuel Storage:

We replaced our two vehicle fuel storage tanks that were well over thirty years old. The new tanks are of modern construction and thus safer with integrated fuel spill protection devices.



Fuel Reclaim:

We upgraded our aviation fuel farm with the installation of reclaim tanks for fuel consumed by our quality control testing process.



Terminal Furniture:

We replaced the furniture in the Terminal to refresh our aging and broken customer seating. The new furniture will provide a comfortable and durable seating for many years to come.



Community

The Airport is supporting various local community and business groups as they utilize our popular meeting facilities.

The Airport contributed to the expansion of parking space at Glacier Hills Pathway through our donation of excess gravel product from our runway improvement project of 2017.
