Dear Commissioner;

We are happy to report that we have had another year of safe operations at the Airport. We received delivery of our new snow blower (that replaces our twenty year old model) that was purchased from a combination Federal, State and local funding sources. We are fortunate to be a part of the Airport Improvement Program (AIP) that provides a significant level of funds for airports that are part of the National Plan of Integrated Airport System (NPIAS). Funds used by the AIP are derived from the Airport and Airway Trust fund that are, in turn, derived from aviation based fuel taxes, user fees, and similar revenue sources.



Antrim County Airport continues to attract new customers to our field even as long-standing customers leave aviation. These new customers have either enrolled in our community hangar program, bought an existing hangar or, in the case of one customer has built a new hangar. Each

action represents a significant decision by the aircraft owner to base their operation at our facility along with a substantial initial investment in the case of hangar owners. The funds generated from this activity help to offset operational cost of the Airport.

An essential aspect of our customer service is having the ability to bring fuel to parked aircraft. And having clean, properly stickered and reliable truck is essential for customer confidence. Our Aviation Fuel truck was refurbished in 2014 at a substantial saving to the taxpayer relative to general market price due to Antrim County Transportation's mechanic's Tom Sandeen & Rob Hott.






