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# ANIMAL CONTROL

## ANIMAL CONTROL

### Operational Highlights

The last five years Antrim County Animal Control has successfully reduced the euthanasia need in the shelter down to primarily only feral (wild), aggressive, dangerous or sick animals. In 2009 the shelter took in 985 animals and euthanized 355. In 2013 we have reduced our intake to 621 and euthanasia down to 185. During these last five (5) years we have been operating as an open intake facility turning no Antrim County resident away when they need to bring in their unwanted pet or stray animal. We have spent a lot of time advertising our adoptable and stray animals on several websites including Facebook, Petfinder, and Craigslist and have seen huge success from this.

We also spend time grooming, bathing, and training animals in our facility. We work closely with local veterinarians and local rescue groups. We also spend six (6) hours a day, five (5) days a week patrolling the county working to educate and assist people with animal control problems. We believe all of these things have contributed to a record year in our shelter.



### GUN REGISTRATION / CPL

New CPL's issued during 2013 totaled 227, while 174 were renewal, compared to 141 New CPL in 2012, and 136 renewals. Three (3) CPL were suspended, and three (3) were reinstated, no change from 2012. One Firearms rights was reinstated in 2013, equal to 2012.

Purchase permits (without CPL) totaled 533 in 2013 compared to 396 in 2012, while 517 Pistol Sales Records (With CPL) were recorded in 2013, an increase from the 427 in 2012.





## EXPENSES

Monthly Pharmacy charges, \$8,466.52 were down by 53% from the previous year's \$18,021.16. Hospital, Doctor Office and ER visits increased from \$26,530.60 to \$42,442.66. Medical supplies increased slightly, \$1,041.93 from the preceding year total of \$854.14. Contracted Jail physician fees totaled \$15,000, the same as the preceding year. Total expenses for 2013 were \$66,951.12 compared to \$60,405.90 in 2012.

Marine Safety Program for 2013 shows 4 Boat accidents handled. 28 hours working 15 Search and Rescue involving 17 boats and 21 persons on the following Lakes, Torch, Clam, East Grand Traverse Bay, Intermediate, Elk, Torch River, and Lake Skegemog.

A Total of one (1) Boater safety class was held with 7 students trained and certified. Proctored exams totaled twenty (20) with sixteen (16) certified.

Officer training totaled 187 hours involving nineteen (19) officers.

A total of thirteen (13) livery inspections were conducted with 92 boats inspected.






